
















Some more unique designs! The experiments with embroidery and pressed leaves can be seen on cards on the far right.

We have been fortunate to have a great influx of ideas over the years. We are immensely grateful for this and would like to celebrate all these creative contributions.







DEEPA, flower pasting team

I joined Shradhanjali when I was 16 years of age on April 15th, 26 years ago. I am now 42.

I did 6 months of flower pressing initially when I first joined. Now I do flower pasting mostly and painting for trays. It is unique work so I like it.

Everyone enjoys the designs made here so it is nice for us to see that. I like the flower designs of trays the most.

 ${\rm I}$ joined at 15 years of age. I am now 48 years of age. I have worked here for 34 years.

I was selling fish in the village before I joined Shradhanjali. One of the ladies I was selling fish to told me about Shradhanjali and I came here to join.

I got interested in card pasting. I like all the designs. I have to thank God that I got work that I like.



Interviews

SAHADEVAN, gardener and care-taker

I have been working in Auroville since the 1970s. So I have been working here for 50 years. I have been in Shradhanjali since 1993, so almost 30 years.

When they told us Auroville was starting 50 years ago, roads needed to be made. I helped in this task. I was a helper at Matrimandir too. I served tea, handed nails, tools to workers. I also helped dig the foundation and erect the scaffolding.

There were no scooters or even cycles. Everyone walked from far to Matrimandir. I walked to work too. I continue to walk from Alankuppam to Shradhanjali today. It must be about 2 km.

Everyday I wake up at 3 am. I come here at 5 am. I work for 5 hours and go back home. Even at home, I have work. I look after the cows and do different kinds of work there. There is continuous work.





KALA, book binding team

I joined Shradhanjali in 1994 - on 7th April 1994. I have been around for 28 years. The years go by fast!

I did flower pressing and pasting initially. Now I do book binding, lampshades, flower picking and envelopes. I like all the work here.

They had organised a workshop few years ago. We made our own designs- the best of which were chosen for production. They chose 2 of my designs - a coconut tree and a flower design.

I didn't work anywhere else before this. This is home now and Abha takes care of us.
